


The Significance of Letters


1. The stroke is often called a horn and Hebrew scholars say that if a "Yod" is lacking the horn then it becomes invalid. Therefore, Torah scrolls that are found lacking even one horn or stroke would be cast out. As a result, Yahshua makes this statement:

MattithYAHU 5:19 Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches *them*, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.
